#### Military Corrective Training Centre

The MCTC is an establishment that provides corrective training for those servicemen and women sentenced to periods of detention; it is not a prison

The principal function of the MCTC is to detain personnel, both male and female, of the three Services and civilians subject to the Armed Forces Act, in accordance with the provisions of the Service Custody and Service of Relevant Sentences Rules 2009 (SCSRSR 09).

### Statutory Provisions

[Health and Justice NHS England](#) has the responsibility for ensuring care is provided within Prison service  
Clinical Commissioning Groups are the responsible commissioner for health services for the community based population

Local Authorities s have the responsible for commissioning many of public health services including substance misuse for people in their area including those who are engaged with the youth and criminal justice system.

#### The National Offender Management Service (NOMS)

is an Executive Agency of the Ministry of Justice. Its purpose is to protect the public and reduce reoffending by delivering the punishment and orders of the courts and supporting rehabilitation by helping offenders to reform their lives.

### Statutory Services

#### Police & Court Liaison and Diversion Service - Sussex

Liaison and Diversion (L&D) services operate within Sussex Police Custody Suites and Magistrates Courts to identify, assess and share information to assist in criminal justice decision making processes and facilitating support and treatment into a range of services.
